With deep regret I report that two of our comrades have entered the Post Everlasting. **Past Adjutant Bob Grindall** passed away on September 25th at his home in Killarney Vale on the New South Wales Central Coast after a long illness. He had been a Post member for 37 years.

He was originally from New York City (the Bronx) and served in the US Air Force for 4 years based at Lackland and Lubbock Air Force Bases in Texas and Luke Air Force Base in Arizona then a tour in Vietnam 1969-70 based at Phan Rang. It was from there he took his R&R leave to Sydney and met his future wife Debbie. He was appointed Post Adjutant in 1979 a post held for 8 years before moving to Killarney Vale. In 1978-79 our Post had only 45 members, **Bob** managed to contact many former members and Vietnam veterans he knew and as a result he brought the Post membership up to 118 by 1981. The Post continued growing to our all-time membership of 182 by 1983. He was the manager of two companies here in Sydney and on his move to the Central Coast was manager of a new Woolworths Supermarket near Gosford. It was there he had a very bad accident at work which caused him to retire from active work and unfortunately his health deteriorated rapidly resulting in his passing in September. His funeral was on October 2nd at Palmdale on the central coast. The Post Commander, Auxiliary Unit President and their daughter Nicole attended the funeral which was "standing room only" in the chapel, which speaks for his popularity of all who knew him. We expressed our condolences on behalf of all his comrades in the Post to wife Debbie, daughter Jennifer and his grandson. He and his father were both Post members back in the 70's although his father lived in Arizona and was a World War 2 US Army veteran of the 91st Infantry Div in the Italian campaigns. His two brothers both served in the US Force, one retiring after 20 years' service. We'll miss you **Bob**, thanks for the memories.

Patrick "Pat" Curtis was a Post member for 11 years and resided with his family in beautiful Port Macquarie on the north coast of New South Wales. **Pat** was an Australian and joined the US Army Small Ships in 1943. He served aboard the **Mactan**. He caught dengue fever at Milne Bay and was hospitalized in Sydney then discharged in 1944 as under age. He later joined the Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF) and served 30 years retiring as a Warrant Officer. He served in the

occupation forces in Japan (1947-49) and in Vietnam (1966) where he was mentioned in the dispatches, equal to receiving a Commendation Medal in the US Forces. He entered the Public Service in 1974 from which he retired (again) in 1992 and was awarded an MBE (Member of the British Empire) by Queen Elizabeth. He eligible to join The American Legion through his service with the US Army Small Ships from which he received an Honorable Discharge from the US Army . When the Small Ships Assoc. was established he served as a Vice-President and later Treasurer.
