#### **Current procedures**

- 1. A request is made at 800-504-4098 or online at www.legion.org/familysupport.
- 2. The caller's name, address, telephone number and request are collected and shared with the Legion department.
- 3. The department refers the request to a local post.
- 4. If resources are available, the local post contacts the family and provides the assistance. If not, the post refers the family to other local agencies.
- 5. In case of financial need, the post supplies the family necessary funds if possible. The post may also help the family apply for American Legion Temporary Financial Assistance if there are minor children in the home.
