Mr. Hoel of Arizona introduced the following bill;

A BILL

Combating the issue of illegal immigration by reforming asylum eligibility and bolstering federal agencies employment to process immigrants at a faster rate.

Be it enacted by The American Legion Boys Nation Senate assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "Protect Our Border Act".

SECTION 2. Asylum Reform

This title imposes additional requirements for asylum eligibility.

- (1) Requires eligibility for Asylum application to be through a United States port of entry only.
- (2) Redefines the term of "credible fear" for asylum officers, requiring that an officer must determine that an applicant is more likely than not to be eligible for asylum through factors such as race, religion, and political belief.

(3) Any type of past criminal record involving a felony invalidates a claim for asylum.

SECTION 3. Expansion of DHS Resources

In order to create

incentive to apply legally, DHS must be given the resources to process applications at a much faster rate than is the standard now.

- (1) DHS must meet a requirement to employ 1000 immigration judges to hear and decide on cases in a timely manner (as of now there is only 600).
- (2) DHS must also reach and maintain an active Border Patrol force of 20,000 within the next 10 years.
