To establish a mandatory retirement age for United States Federal Court Judges at all levels and for United States Supreme Court Justices.

Mr. Black of Florida introduced the following bill;

A BILL

To establish a mandatory retirement age for United States Federal Court Judges at all levels and for United States Supreme Court Justices.

Be it enacted by The American Legion Boys Nation Senate assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "The Judiciary Act of 2023".

SECTION 2. DEFINITION. The term "Judge" as used in this Bill shall be defined as a Federal District or Appellate Court Judge, or Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States.

SECTION 3. ESTABLISHING A MANDATORY RETIREMENT AGE.

A judge shall cease to hold office on attaining the age of seventy-five (75) years.

SECTION 4. EXCEPTIONS

A. A Judge who has retired may, with the agreement the Chief Judge of the District or Circuit, or Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, as applicable, continue to participate in judgements already proceeding before the Judge prior to the mandatory retirement, for a period not to exceed six (6) months after the date of retirement.

B. A Judge shall be entitled to six (6) months of their pre-retirement pay should the Judge be included under Section 4(a).

SECTION 5. APPLICABILITY.

Any and all Judges seated at the time of this Bill's passage are exempt from the mandatory retirement ages specified in Section 3.
