Mr. Gorman of New Jersey introduced the following bill;

A BILL

An act banning artificial intelligence from replacing working-class driving as a form of employment, how 3% of Americans find work. This act ensures their jobs are protected from AI replacements also ensuring the stability of our economy.

Be it enacted by The American Legion Boys Nation Senate assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "An Act to Protect America's Working Drivers".

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS

Let the following, when referenced in this bill, be defined as-

Define Artificial Intelligence or AI as a computer or system that uses programming to make self-driving systems for cars or any fully autonomous driving system.

Define driver as anyone whose main source of employment is driving including truck drivers, delivery

drivers, taxi drivers, and/or bus drivers.

SECTION 3. BAN THE REPLACEMENT OF HUMAN DRIVERS WITH ARTIFICIAL

ALTERNATIVES

Following the passage of this bill, it will be illegal to replace any driving positions in the workforce

with AI or any form of autonomous driver.

1. Any positions already replaced with autonomous driving will be given a 3-month grace period to

find human drivers to take back the positions held by any autonomous vehicles.

SECTION 4. PENALTY OF VIOLATIONS

All businesses found to outsource human driving to autonomous driving vehicles will receive a fine

equivalent to 30% of the company's gross yearly income.

1. If found in violation of the regulations set within this bill at any time within a given fiscal year, the

30% fine will be charged at the conclusion of the fiscal year and continued to be fined for every year's

gross income in which they continue to violate the regulations.

SECTION 5. ENFORCEMENT

The enforcement of all regulations and fines for violations will be overseen by the Federal Trade

Commission (FTC).

1. Any funding necessary for this bill will be taken from the Department of Commerce's budget.

SECTION 6. TERMINATION

This bill shall be enacted at the start of the first fiscal year following its passage.
