

What is Chronic Kidney Disease?

Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD)

- Permanent damage to the kidneys
- Usually no signs or symptoms
- Cannot be reversed, however it can often be slowed
- Can lead to kidney failure, also known as end-stage renal disease (ESRD)





Kidney disease in children

Each year, an estimated 1 out of every 65,000 children in the United States has kidney failure. Children with kidney failure have a different experience with this disease than adults and face many challenges, which can include:

- Growth delay
- Developmental delay
- Anemia
- Bone disease
- Nerve damage

- Sleep problems
- Trouble controlling their bladder
- Behavior problems
- Emotional problems
- Issues with self-image

The most common causes of kidney disease in children are:

- Kidney birth defects
- Genetic diseases
- Kidney infection
- Nephrotic syndrome

- Systemic diseases
- Kidney trauma or injury
- Problems with the urinary system






