Roberts of Fort Bayard, New Mexico was the only female veteran attending this convention and was elected to attend the first American Legion National Convention in the United States in November of 1919.

In NADHAL, we have talked for years about adding an electronic history contest to our Narrative and Yearbook National Contests. Here we need to make sure that our National Library has the resources to judge an electronic contest. We have the guidelines for the Narrative History Book and the Yearbook History Book in the most current Officer's Guide, but we need to develop guidelines for an electronic history book along with the judging criteria. Currently if submitting a disk and/or flash/thumb drive the book would need to be printed using the guidelines in our most current Officer's Guide for judging.
