Veterans and Children Foundation (VCF)

(2023-2024 goal was to raise \$380,743 based on Squadrons donating \$1 per member)

- Raised approximately \$70k per CSR reporting
- Reason / Findings for not making goal
 - ➤ Limited resources and documentation on the program
 - ➤ Lack of CSR reporting on the squadrons
 - No incentives for the squadrons that donate to the program such as awards or ribbons



Veterans and Children Foundation (continued)

(2024-2025 goal is to raise \$500,000 per the direction of SAL National Commander Navarette)

- Approximately \$1.25 per member
- Developed an Ad-hoc VCF Committee to assist with goal
- The National C&Y Committee will research the idea of providing awards and/or ribbons for donations to VCF

Child Welfare Foundation (CWF)

(2023-2024 goal was to raise \$380,743 based on squadrons donating \$1 per member)

- Raised a total of \$489,185.60 which is \$1.28/member
- Hit the \$10 million in donations milestone; starting in 1988
- \$684,050 was awarded in grants in 2024



Child Welfare Foundation (continued)

(2024-2025 goal is to continue \$1 per member)

- Working on new merchandise ideas for 2025 convention
- New slogan campaign; "Feel like heaven, if we hit 11!"





Children's Organ Transplant Association

Mission: The Children's Organ Transplant Association (COTA) helps children and young adults who need a life-saving transplant by providing fundraising assistance and family support.

- Bring awareness to the program
 - > \$160 million raised since 1986
 - Over 1,000 patients supported
 - > Zero (0) cost to families!
- Working with Detachments to see who is actively supporting the program

American Legion Family Day

- Promoting American Legion Family Day on the last Saturday in April.
- Send out flyers and advertising to the local community to promote the event.



American Legion Family Day (continued)

 Family Day 2024 was a success as Posts throughout the country opened their doors to the community!









Parent / Child Initiative

(Develop a program to support our younger members that involves both the parent and child.)

- The National C&Y Committee introduced a youth garden where children can grow their own vegetables with assistance from parents/adults.
- Garden included a pizza-shaped planter to grow pizza toppings and herbs such as basil and oregano.
- The pilot program was located in Maryland.



Parent / Child Initiative (continued)

- Youth Garden received national and local recognition!
 - > Article in legion.org
 - > Articles in local and national newspapers
 - CBS news clip that reached at least 16 states
 - > Articles in both the SAL Roundup and Millennium
