Announced July 7, this is roughly two-thirds less than VA's goal reported earlier in the year. Of the less-than-expected reduction, American Legion National Commander said, "We commend VA leadership for conducting this assessment in a reasonable, deliberate manner, guided by analysis across the enterprise in consultation with Legionnaires and input from major stakeholders. This approach was critical to making informed decisions that should ensure delivery of health care and benefits to veterans is not compromised."
