

Certification of Officers: Thank you to the Posts who have recently

held elections and sent in the Notification forms. I can add all Post Officers to the Post Officers Roster on myLegion.org. Reminder, after Post elections or a change in Post Officers, it is required to send two forms to the Department Adjutant.

- 1. Notification of Post/Squadron Commanders & Adjutants: This form must be sent to the Department Adjutant immediately (within 24 hours) after Post elections. The form should be dated the date of the elections/appointment.
- 2. Post Officer Certification of Service Form: This form has been revised and sent to all Posts. It needs to be forwarded to the Department Adjutant as soon as possible after Post elections (within 15 days). The Effective Date of Election of Appointment is the date of the original election or appointment. For example, if an Officer was elected on 1 May 2023 and reelected on 1 May 2024, the

Effective Date block will show 1 May 2023.

These forms are critical to keep the current Post Officer informed of Department news. If I do not have the correct information, your Post may not receive vital information.

Ladies and Gentlemen of the Department of France. The date for the 4th DEC/Conv/1st DEC is rapidly approaching. With this, we will be asking for each Post to contribute to the Veterans & Children Foundation. This is the program that is replacing the Legacy Scholarship Fund, which now has enough money to be selfsupporting. Below I have attached just what this program stands for and its purpose. Please, let's all come together and show our Department support for this program.

A Foundation of Hope

The American Legion Veterans & Children Foundation feeds and houses children of military personnel and veterans facing urgent, unexpected hardships. It prevents eviction, keeps the power on and fulfills basic needs to hold a family together through difficult times.

The foundation also covers rigorous training and accreditation costs for American Legion claims experts who provide free representation for veterans and families applying for disability benefits, survivor assistance, GI Bill opportunities and more.

Since its inception in 1925 as the American Legion Endowment Fund, the foundation has assisted millions of veterans, their families and children in need. In 2019, the American Legion Endowment Fund began doing business as the American Legion Veterans & Children Foundation to more clearly state who benefits from tax-deductible donations to the

separate non-profit 501c3 element of the nation's largest veterans organization.

The foundation relies entirely on charitable donations from individuals, like-minded associations and corporate allies.

At any one time, more than 3,000 trained and accredited American Legion service officers are handling the needs of 750,000 or more U.S. military veterans who have become disabled through service to our nation, as well as their families, who may be caregivers, surviving spouses or dependent children.

The American Legion Temporary Financial Assistance program ensures that qualified military and veteran families with minor children at home can pay for food, clothing other shelter, or necessities sudden. when unexpected financial hardships strike. The program distributes between \$250,000 and \$1.2 million each year in one-time cash grants of up to \$1,500 each.



Armed Forces Day May 18, 2024

American Legion Family members celebrate Armed Forces Day to honor the men and women who serve in the United States military.

Post TH01 Commander Bruce Templeman transferred to Post Everlasting:



1961 - 2024



On March 19, 2024 at approximately 2000 hours our commander Bruce Templeman suddenly suffered a fatal heart attack and died.

Bruce's funeral was held at Wat Sumang Khalaram, Loeng Nok Tha. Yasothon Province of Thailand on Saturday March 23. In attendance were Bruce's wife (Noi), Thai family members, and local friends. Also in attendance were many members of Brig Gen Robin Olds American Legion Thailand Post TH01. Bill Ahlberg, the



Commander of American Legion Thailand Post TH02 also was in attendance. Members of the VFW also attended the funeral including Randy Riggs the District 5 Commander and Rick Rees. Visitation and prayer service were held at Bruce's home. At 1:00 o'clock Bruce's body was moved to the village temple for the final service.



A special Honor Guard was formed comprised of members of Post TH01, members of Post TH02 and members of the VFW. The Honor Guard performed the traditional flag folding ceremony and presented the flag to Bruce's widow.

Acting Commander Ted Potyrala presented the eulogy highlighting Bruce's impact to our Post. Chaplain Rob Davis delivered a touching prayer for Bruce. Post TH02 Commander Bill Ahlberg and his wife recited, in both English and Thai, a moving poem titled Miss Me. But Let Me Go.



For those that wonder why we perform the honor guard duties and want to know how it impacts the family, friends, and community this one picture tells it all.

Bruce served with the USMC 1978-1984 and the USAF 1984-2011. His duty for the Marines was as a cook and security guard and in services with the DC Air National Guard. His duty stations include Marine Barracks NAS Norfolk and Andrews AFB DC.



Bruce was a PUFL member of the American Legion with 20 continuous membership years. Bruce transferred to Post TH01 in 2016. He served the post as Sergent at Arms 2016-2017, 1st Vice Commander 2018-2020, Commander 2020-2024. Bruce also served as an Embassy volunteer helping American veterans living in Thailand who needed help. At the time of his death Bruce was also acting Commander of VFW Post 10217. Bruce truly was a veteran serving veterans.



We will miss Bruce greatly. Bruce left a large void in the Post and in our hearts that will be hard to fill. Rest in peace our Comrade and Brother in Arms:
