Just a few days ago, July 30 HR1815 which is titled the Home Loan Program Reform Act was signed into law.

In a nutshell, it is a partial claim program at the VA as part of the efforts to modernize the VA Home

Loan program - which currently serves 3.7 million veterans - to allow veterans who have fallen behind on their mortgages to receive federal assistance which is already available through other federal housing programs. Currently, nearly 70,000 veteran homeowners are more than 90 days late on their mortgage payments. This bill provides these veterans with needed relief and a second chance to keep their homes. H.R. 1815 also includes the proper funding levels for the VA Grant and Per Diem program, as part of VA's homelessness prevention programs to fund community agencies providing services to veterans experiencing homelessness.

The American Legion National Commander James LaCoursiere provided comment to the passage of this bill:

"On behalf of The American Legion's 1.5 million members, I extend our deepest gratitude to Chairman Bost, Ranking Member Takano, Congressman VanOrden, and the dedicated staff of the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs for their steadfast leadership in advancing and securing the final passage of H.R. 1815, the VA Home Loan Program Reform Act. This critical legislation represents a profound commitment to safeguarding the financial security and dignity of veteran homeowners, especially during times of hardship. Your timely action ahead of the August recess reflects unwavering dedication to those who have borne the battle. We commend your continued advocacy on behalf of America's veterans."

Health emergency while traveling?

How to access your VA health care benefits on the road.

You're halfway through a dream vacation—maybe a beach in Mexico, a national park in Utah, or visiting family across the country—when something goes wrong and you have a health emergency. It's the kind of thing that can derail a trip—but it doesn't have to.

If you're a Veteran who receives care at VA or under the <u>Foreign Medical Program</u> (FMP), or a family member who is covered through the <u>Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Department of Veterans Affairs</u> (CHAMPVA), you can still access the health care you need.

Need help in the U.S.? Veterans should call VA Health Connect

Help is just one phone call away with <u>VA Health</u>
<u>Connect</u> when an unexpected health issue pops up. If you need to make, reschedule or cancel an appointment; refill a prescription; or get advice during a health scare, VA staff are there to answer your call 24/7.

If you're ill, you can <u>talk with a nurse</u> who can help you figure out what's going on and what to do next—like directing you to nearby urgent care or even connecting you with an emergency doctor for a virtual visit. Just call your VA medical center and choose option 3 to reach a nurse for advice.

If you go to an emergency room, be sure to notify VA within 72 hours of receiving care.

Quick tip: Bring your VA medical center number with you when you leave town.

Veteran traveling abroad? Use FMP

If you're a Veteran heading out of the country, make sure you're signed up for <u>FMP</u>. It covers treatment for service-connected disabilities while you're overseas—and VA foots the bill. No surprise charges, no confusing insurance.

Signing up is free and the process is simple. You can apply <u>online</u> or by mail. Once enrolled, you'll have peace of mind wherever you go.

Quick tip: Register for FMP before you travel.

Covered under CHAMPVA?

If you're a beneficiary covered under <u>CHAMPVA</u>, keep the following in mind:

- Always travel with your CHAMPVA ID card.
- Understand what CHAMPVA covers while on the road in the U.S. or territories; not every medical provider accepts CHAMPVA. Be sure to ask before you accept services.
- If you're traveling overseas or taking a cruise, you may need to pay up front, but you'll be reimbursed after your claim is processed.
- If you pay out of pocket, keep detailed payment receipts and medical billing records. You'll need them when filing for reimbursement.

Quick tip: Keep a picture of your CHAMPVA ID card on your phone.

Hope everyone has a great August. Enjoy some sunshine and what is left of summer




