-The Rosenhof Hotel near Ramstein setup a very nice lunch for us and we share wonderful camaraderie enjoying that meal. Many Thanks for the Rosenhof Hotel Staff!!!

-Once we returned back to the seminar room, I gave an emotional, for me, briefing on Be The One. It was 1989 when I lost a very close friend of mine, on my Aircrew who told me he was going to die by suicide, that he had already saved up his pills and that he had already changed his life insurance policy to also include suicide. I did not know what to do, I hugged him and asked him to consider all that he had to live for and let him walk out of my door. I went to the base chaplain the very next day and informed him that I was very concerned for my friend and asked him to check in on him. The next day I heard the news that my friend went through with his plan on ending his life. I was devastated! Most of the Legionnaires in the room raised their hand when asked if they know of a veteran who had died by suicide. Be The One is not a MOTTO, it is a MISSION!!!

-GR06 Past Commander Michael Pierce phoned in from Chicago and gave a great deal of information about Boys State. Thanks Mike! By the Way, it is that time where we need to get our Post nominations and applications to Mike Pierce to attend Boys State.

-Our Department Chaplain Brad Bell gave a very clear and compassionate briefing on the duties of Post Chaplain and also gave us some interesting information on the Four Chaplains who died together going down on the Dorchester after being hit by a German torpedo holding on to each other while singing religious songs after they had given their life jackets to young

soldiers selflessly. Very moving presentation Chaplain!

-Our Department Service Officer Frank Phillips signed on virtually and gave us a informative briefing on Foreign Medical Program (FMP). Since we have no VA overseas, did you know that you can be seen at any medical facility overseas for a Service Connected issue you have and FMP will cover your medical costs?

-And lastly our Department Finance Officer Larry Atkins provided us with a great foundation of how not to get your Post in trouble financially. He also covered what he expects each Post

Finance Officer to do with the IRS, Post Financial Reports and a Financial Audit each year. Also that some of our Posts still do not have a Bank in US Dollars thus making a whole lot of extra work on many people when it comes to National providing the Posts with their PUFL checks once a year. Larry, I can't thank you enough for the time you put into that briefing.

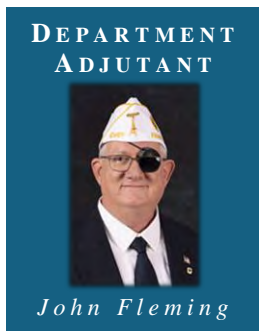
Here are some photos from that event. I fully believe we should do it again next year in Person and Virtual again.

Consolidated Post Report (CPR) – is now available on myLegion.org, so please log in and start adding the 2025-2026 Report. This report covers the period 1 June 2025 to 31 May 2026. You can also download a copy of the form if you would like to use it to keep notes of your Posts activities. [CPR](#)

Certification of Officers: Thank you to the Posts who have recently held

elections and sent in the Notification forms. I can add all Post Officers to the Post Officers Roster on myLegion.org. Reminder, after Post elections or a change in Post Officers, it is required to send two forms to the Department Adjutant.

1. Notification of Post/Squadron Commanders & Adjutants: This form must be sent to the Department Adjutant immediately (within 24 hours) after Post elections. The form should be dated the date of the elections/appointment.

2. Post Officer Certification of Service Form: This form has been revised and sent to all Posts. It needs to be forwarded to the Department Adjutant as soon as possible after Post elections (within 15 days). The Effective Date of Election of Appointment is the date of the original election or appointment. For example, if an Officer was elected on 1 May 2023 and reelected on 1 May 2024, the

Effective Date block will show 1 May 2023.

These forms are critical to keep the current Post Officer informed of Department news. If I do not have the correct information, your Post may not receive vital information.

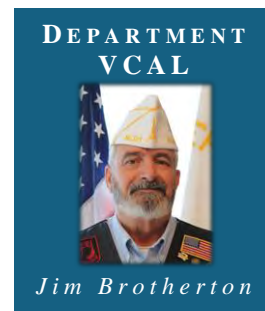

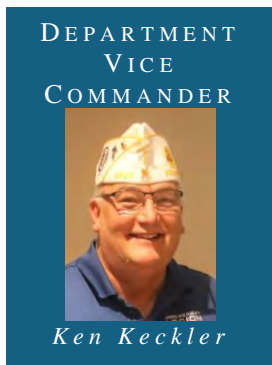

THE AMERICAN LEGION Oratorical Contest

Dear Students, Parents, and Educators,
On behalf of the American Legion Eifel Post GR20, I am writing to provide you with comprehensive details regarding the upcoming 2026 American Legion Department Oratorical Contest. As many of you are aware, our goal is to provide a platform where young leaders can demonstrate their speaking abilities and their knowledge of the United States Constitution. To ensure the best possible environment for our contestants and to resolve recent scheduling conflicts with Spangdahlem High School, we have finalized a new venue and timeline for the event.

Please review the following information carefully to ensure you arrive at the correct location on time.

Event Logistics and Timing

To allow for proper setup, sound checks, and contestant briefings, we ask that all participants adhere strictly to the following schedule:

Date: Saturday, March 14, 2026

Registration Begins: 11:00 AM

Contest Commencement: 12:00 PM (Noon) prompt

Why the Change?

Due to conflicting schedules and facility overlaps at Spangdahlem High School, we have relocated the contest to Gindorf. Our priority is to provide a quiet, professional, and dignified atmosphere where our orators can speak without distraction. This venue offers the necessary space for both the prepared orations and the private consultation required for the assigned topic discourse.

About the Contest Requirements

The American Legion Oratorical Contest exists to develop a deeper knowledge and appreciation of the Constitution of the United States among high school students.

1. The Prepared Oration:

Participants will deliver a researched speech (8 to 10 minutes in length) on an aspect of the Constitution, emphasizing the duties and obligations of a citizen to our government.

Assigned Topics for 2026 Oratorical Contest:

Amendment IV The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no Warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized.

Article III Section 3. Treason against the United States, shall consist only in levying War against them, or in adhering to their Enemies, giving them Aid and Comfort. No Person shall be

convicted of Treason unless on the Testimony of two Witnesses to the same overt Act, or on Confession in open Court.

The Congress shall have Power to declare the Punishment of Treason, but no Attainder of Treason shall work Corruption of Blood, or Forfeiture except during the Life of the Person attainted.

Article IV Section 4. The United States shall guarantee to every State in this Union a Republican Form of Government, and shall protect each of them against Invasion; and on Application of the Legislature, or of the Executive (when the Legislature cannot be convened) against domestic Violence.

Article VI Clause 3. The Senators and Representatives before mentioned, and the Members of the several State Legislatures, and all executive and judicial Officers, both of the United States and of the several States, shall be bound by Oath or Affirmation, to support this Constitution; but no religious Test shall ever be required as a Qualification to any Office or public Trust under the United States.

We are incredibly proud of the hard work these students have put into their research and delivery. We strongly encourage family members, peers, and mentors to attend and support these impressive young citizens as they compete for the opportunity to advance to the next level of the competition. 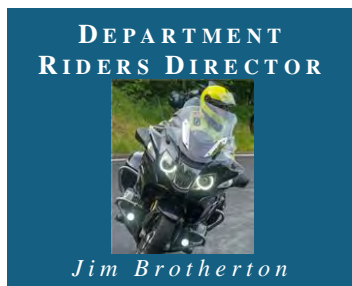
And finally, my thoughts on our MWC: Kudos to our indefatigable VCAL for pulling off a very successful mission!!!

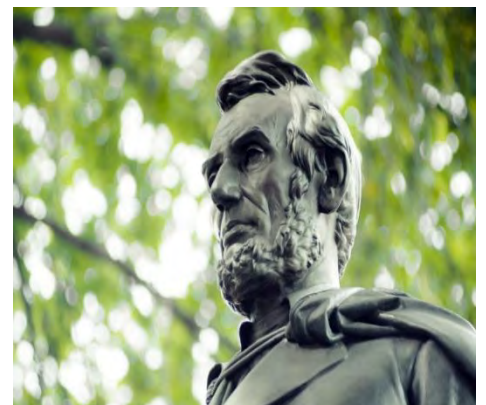

Lincoln's Birthday - 12 February 2026

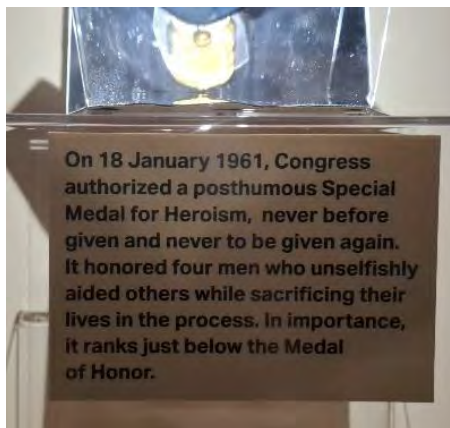
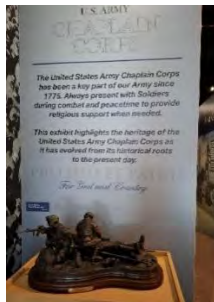
Some states observe the day as part of [Presidents' Day](#), which is officially known as Washington's Birthday.
