#### Post, Squadron donate food

The Gladstone Michigan August Mattson American Legion and the Sons of the American Legion have made a \$400 Donation to the Gladstone St. Vincent De Paul Food Pantry.

According to Squadron Commander Randy Bruntjens and Post Commander Barry Holm, "Our groups were looking for a great way to give back to the Community and thought this donation just before Christmas when the shelves are a bit lower was the best time to help the pantry with their needs and their hope to re-stock the shelves. This is the time after baskets are filled when the need is the greatest."

#### Legion scholarship for 2024 Boys State, Girls State participants

If you are a high school junior who will be attending an American Legion Boys State or Auxiliary Girls State program this summer, you may be eligible for the Samsung American Legion Scholarship.

The Samsung American Legion Scholarship is available for high school juniors who participate in the current session of American Legion Boys State or Auxiliary Girls State and are a direct descendant (or legally adopted child) of a U.S. military veteran who served honorably on active duty during a period of war (April 6, 1917–Nov. 11, 1918; or Dec. 7, 1941, until a date as determined by Congress). The 2024 Samsung American Legion Scholarship application is online. Apply here.

All applications must be submitted using the online application system. Scholarship applicants must complete and submit their online application prior to 11:59 p.m. (local time) of Day 1 of their respective American Legion Boys State

or American Legion Auxiliary Girls State program.

The scholarship awards up to \$10,000 for undergraduate studies (e.g., room and board, tuition, and books). Each applicant is selected according to his or her involvement in school and community activities, academic record, and financial need.

A Boys and Girls State participant from each state is selected as a finalist for the Samsung American Legion Scholarship. During the American Legion's Fall Meetings in October 2024, the Committee on Youth Education will select the scholarship winners. All scholarship recipients will be notified of their award.

### A scholarship for children of the fallen, disabled

The American Legion | January 9, 2024

If you are the child of a parent who lost their life while honorably serving on active military duty on or after 9/11 or is a post-9/11 veteran with a combined VA disability rating of 50 percent or higher, you are eligible to apply for The American Legion Legacy Scholarship.

The 2024 American Legion Legacy Scholarship application is online. The application deadline is March 27.

Since the Legacy Scholarship's first grant in 2004, 825 military children of the fallen and disabled have received over \$6.2 million in financial assistance for higher learning. The following are ways the scholarship has helped recipients:

"Receiving this scholarship over the course of my medical school career has truly been a life-changing opportunity for me. This scholarship helped me alleviate the financial stress that comes with the rigorous training required to become a doctor."

"Thank you for awarding me with The American Legion Legacy Scholarship. It is a great privilege to be a recipient of your generosity, and I look forward to utilizing these funds in pursuit of my college education. Your help will allow me to pursue my dreams of becoming an officer of the CIA and for that I am extremely grateful."

The Legacy Scholarship provides financial aid for graduate or post-graduate tuition, books, room and board, meal plans and other supplies needed to achieve a higher education. It is a needs-based scholarship – the grant amount each scholarship recipient will receive will be based on his or her financial need after all federal and state aid is exhausted. Recipients will have a year to use the grant and may reapply to The American Legion Legacy Scholarship up to six times.

The number of scholarships awarded, and the amount of financial aid granted to each awardee (this includes returning applicants) will be determined on donations to the scholarship fund and one's financial needs.

#### Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation Report

Hello my brother Sons,

Your members of the National VA&R Commission hope that all of you had a wonderful holiday season. It is hard to believe that January is about over. In this article we will talk about another program that your National Commission is promoting. The National Veterans Creative Arts Festival (NVCAF) is an amazing rehabilitation program for our Veterans.

Nationwide Veterans Affairs Medical Centers (VAMC) use the creative arts as a form of rehabilitative treatment to help Veterans recover from and cope with physical and emotional disabilities.

From across the country each year Veterans who are enrolled at VA health facilities compete in local creative arts competitions. With categories in the visual arts that range from oil painting to leather work to paint by number kits. There are also categories in writing, as well as the performing arts from music, dance, and drama. The winners at the local level are then sent to National for judging with first, second and third being awarded. The first place winning Veterans are then invited to the NVCAF which is hosted by a different VA each year. I will say that I have been lucky to have gone to five different NVCAF stage/art shows which are free to attend & they are amazing to see. And I was lucky enough to have been able to volunteer for the entire week of the festival in April of 2023 in St Louis, MO. And I cannot begin to tell you what collaborating with these Veterans for the week hearing their stories and seeing what the Creative Arts is doing to help with their seen and unseen injuries.

Veterans who are enrolled with a VAMC and receive care there or at a CBOC or

Vet Center are eligible for the festival. Veterans can submit only one piece per category but can submit in multiple categories.

The co-sponsors for the event are the Department of Veterans Affairs and the National American Legion Auxiliary. The 2024 festival is from May 11 - 18 and is sponsored by the Denver VAMC. If you are interested in going to the stage and art show, contact the Dept of Colorado American Legion Auxiliary for the free tickets. If you want to volunteer contact the Colorado Auxiliary or the Denver VA and ask for Volunteer Services (CDCE) to find the point of contact for the event. You will not be sorry after either going to the show or helping with the event.

We are now coming into February, and February is not just for romantics. The week of February 14th is a special week for the VA System. Over nine million of our women & men veterans are celebrated during National Salute Week. Our Veterans that are cared for in VAMC's, Community Based Outpatient Clinics, Domiciliary, & Nursing Homes. The purpose of the National Salute to Veterans Program is to pay tribute & express our appreciation to our Veterans, increase community awareness of the role of the VAMC & to encourage the public to visit our hospitalized Veterans & to hopefully become volunteers.

In closing, please remember our Veterans in VAMC's, Community Living Centers (CLC), nursing homes and our State-run VA Homes. They get a lot of visitors and events during the holidays but tend to get lost in the shuffle as the year progresses. Even if you are from a small squadron and you do not have the resources to do a facility wide event. You can always sponsor an event on the wards. You can do a ward bingo or a cookout, cater an event. The wards are typically 20 - 30 patients and it would

not cost your squadron very much to do something at that level.

#### Children & Youth Committee

Greetings from the SAL National Children and Youth Committee!

This year, the committee is focused on bringing awareness to the National C&Y month in April and American Legion Family Day on April 27, 2024, where American Legion posts are encouraged to open their doors to the community for a day to recognize the accomplishments of the American Legion family.

The C&Y committee had a meeting last month to discuss the approval of their parent/child initiative project. We decided to introduce a pizza garden to support the parent / children initiative. The garden will be a project where the parent/child will work together to make the ingredients of a pizza locally at the post home or a personal location. The children will learn the basics of horticulture by preparing the soil, sunlight, and the right plants to make the project a success. After harvesting the product, the post family can make the pizza together for dinner or sell a few pizzas for a fundraiser.

Some concerns addressed were that the pizza garden would not be as successful in the northern states due to colder weather. Overall, the plan was well accepted by the C&Y Committee, Americanism Chairman Casey, and the C&Y NEC liaisons.

In addition, the garden is easy to make and there are many websites that can provide tips on how to make a successful pizza garden.

We continue to promote the Children's Organ Transplant Association (COTA) program which is a premier organization that provides fundraising assistance to transplant families.

Another program the committee has focused on is the Veterans and Children Foundation (VCF). VCF provides vital support for military and veteran parents in unexpected financial crises and support for service officers in their tireless efforts to obtain care and due benefits and opportunities of disabled veterans and families. This year's goal for the Detachments to donate to the VCF is \$1.00 per capita. This will help the foundation to be self-sufficient and be able to assist more Veterans and Children during emergency relief efforts.

We continue to work with the Americanism Commission updating the Youth Academy program at the National Convention. The C&Y Committee has been assigned to develop a badge program working with the National Program Coordinator for junior activities to obtain patch and badge approvals. We plan to have additional information in April 2024.

The C&Y Committee hopes everyone had a safe and happy holiday season. We look forward to seeing everyone at the Spring NEC.

Membership ending in 2023 ended at another all-time high for the National Organization. 46 of 55 Detachments over 100% with a final count of 380,743 members for 103.52% and a retention rate of 89.36%.

We have had another spectacular year as far as of January 19<sup>th</sup> 60% goal we have 53/55 Detachments over goal.
