SONS OF THE AMERICAN LEGION



VETERANS AFFAIRS & REHABILITATION

- 4,124 hours logged in VA hospitals by volunteer Legionnaires
- Veterans Rehabilitation Court expanded to three locations: Sioux Falls, Rapid City and Watertown
- Highly Rural Transportation Program expanded VA appointment service to 18 counties in Central SD
- 5.832 Funeral Honors performed



CHILDREN & YOUT

- \$103,443 in Temporary Financial Assistance awarded from Department and National levels
- 24,447 children and youth participated in activities across South Dakota
- 1,725 military and veteran families received assistance or goods
- Over 6,500 volunteer hours tallied in Children & Youth programs

AMFRICANISM

- Posts sponsored an average of 80 Baseball teams across 4 divisions
- 508 Oratorical Contest Participants, with National placings two years
- 1,486 Boys State youth sponsored
- Flag Education provided in over 200 Schools
- State and local scholarships totaled over \$180,000




NATIONAL SECURITY
