Number of additional Special Immigrant Visas authorized for Afghan refugees who were allies of U.S. forces in the global war on terrorism, through the late-December passage of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023, which contained multiple provisions supported by American Legion national resolutions and legislative priorities.



Veterans identified as concerns for exposure to toxic contamination while in the military, after more than 19,000 were screened between September and December, to determine eligibility for disability benefits under The American Legion-supported PACT Act, signed into law last August.



American Legion posts that conducted blood-donation events during the 2021-22 program year, which generated no less than 92,162 units, a 15-year high.



Minimum number of American Legion posts that conducted Buddy Check operations in the 2021-22 membership year.
