

Nora G. won the contest held at Stuttgart High School. Nora, a Junior, earned 1st Place, the Gold Oratorical Medal, a Certificate of Distinction, \$1,000.00, and will now compete at the National Finals on 17-19 May 2024, in Hillsdale, MI, against winners of contests from other Departments.

Each contestant delivered a prepared oration as well as an oration on a randomly assigned constitutional topic. Nora impressed the judges with her speech and the way that she presented her speech.

# The American Legion Oratorical Contest: A Judge's Perspective

As a Public Affairs specialist and judge at this year's American Legion High School Oratorical Scholarship Program, I found myself immersed in a captivating display of youthful intellect, passion, and eloquence. Hosted by Stuttgart Post 6 on Panzer Kaserne in Stuttgart, the event showcased the final contest of the American Legion Department of France, drawing contestants from across Europe, each vying for the prestigious title.

Since its inception in 1938, the Oratorical Contest has served as a platform for high school students to hone their speaking skills while delving into the depths of American constitutional history. It's not just about delivering speeches; it's about instilling leadership qualities, fostering a deep understanding of the nation's laws, and cultivating the art of clear and critical thinking among participants.

One cannot understate the significance of judges in this contest. Tasked with evaluating speeches without bias, we were reminded of the weight of our responsibility. Before the event, we refrained from any publicity, ensuring our decisions were based solely on the merits of the speeches. During the contest, we were strategically seated apart, rendering our decisions independently, free from consultation.

Among the judges for this prestigious contest were Col. Kirk Alexander, Commander of USAG Stuttgart, Command Sgt Maj. Denice Malave,

Amy Barreiro, and Daniel Romero adding a distinguished level of expertise and insight to the evaluation process.

The criteria for assessment were rigorous and comprehensive. We evaluated speech originality,

subject knowledge, and logical organization. But it wasn't just about content; we also scrutinized delivery—volume, rate, pitch, diction, poise, posture, gestures, and expressions—all factors contributing to the overall impact of the oration.

Among the five contestants, one shone brightly—a true star in the making. Nora Gibbons, a Junior at Brussels American High School (Flanders Field Post BEO2), captivated the audience with her profound understanding of the Constitution, delivering her speech with a blenc of confidence, clarity, and conviction that belied her youth. But let's not overlook Jacop Barnes, a Junior at Wiesbaden High School Rhein Main Post GR05), the Ione male participant, whose exceptional public speaking talent earned him a close second place. Additionally, Bryce Watts, also a Junior from Wiesbaden High School (Riley Leroy Pitts Post GR 05), secured 3rd place in the competition.



Contestants Alexandra "Red" Rossmann, a Senior from Lakenheath High School (Liberty Post EGO2), and Caitlyn Fields, a Freshman from Stuttgart High School (Stuttgart Post GR06), also displayed remarkable individuality and talent, grappling with the complexities of constitutional law in a commendable and impressive manner.

In a competition where speaking for a minimum of eight minutes on constitutional matters is no easy feat, their dedication and resilience were evident. The unexpected challenge of a nonprepared oratorical, with only five minutes to prepare on a topic like the 23rd Amendment, added an extra layer of difficulty. Yet, once again, contestants rose to the occasion, demonstrating their ability to think on their feet and deliver compelling arguments with grace and acumen.

While some contestants may have emerged as frontrunners, it's essential to recognize the talent and potential of all participants. Each one brought something unique to the stage, enriching the contest with their perspectives and insights.

As the event concluded, it became clear that the American Legion Oratorical Contest is not just about winning scholarships—it's about empowering the next generation of leaders, scholars, and orators. And from what I witnessed today, the future looks bright indeed.

\*\*\*\*Annual Post Data Form Report: On Monday, 29 January 2024, I emailed the newly received Annual Post Data Report 2025 Membership Year. This form is different from the Post Data Form that was previously emailed to all the Posts. This form MUST be completed

and returned to me by 10 April 2024. I will be returning ALL forms to National HQs no later than 15 April 2024, whether I receive a reply or not.

As everyone should be aware by now, National voted to increase the National per capita by \$5.00 effective 1 July 2024 for the 2025 Membership Year.

With this change, the National per capita, \$23.50, plus the Department per capita, \$6.50, will be \$30.00. If your Post dues are \$30.00 or less, you need to update that information on the Annual Post Data Report 2025 Membership Year Form to inform National of your Post's new annual dues amount. If you do not change your Post dues, you will not receive any dues from Annual Members beginning 1 July 2024. These forms must be returned to me by 10 April 2024 so I can ensure that we meet the National suspense date.

If you already sent the Post Data Report Form, you still need to complete the Annual Post Data Report 2025 Membership Year.

Consolidated Post Report / Consolidated Squadron Report (CPR/CSR) — We need to be working on these now. It is available on myLegion.org, so every time you have an event you can start filling it in. Please do not finalize it until June 2024. The final date to submit is 31 July 2024.

Certification of Officers: Thank you to the Posts who have recently held elections and sent in the Notification forms. I can add all Post Officers to the Post Officers Roster on myLegion.org. Reminder, after Post elections or a change in Post Officers, it is required to send two forms to the Department Adjutant.

1. Notification of Post/Squadron Commanders & Adjutants: This form must be sent to the Department Adjutant immediately (within 24 hours) after Post

elections. The form should be dated the date of the elections/appointment.

2. Post Officer Certification of Service Form: This form has been revised and sent to all Posts. It needs to be forwarded to the Department Adjutant as soon as possible after Post elections (within 15 days). The Effective Date of Election of Appointment is the date of the original election or appointment. For example, if an Officer was elected on 1 May 2023 and reelected on 1 May 2024, the Effective Date block will show 1 May 2023.

These forms are critical to keep the current Post Officer informed of Department news. If I do not have the correct information, your Post may not receive vital information.

Please contact me for any questions or if you need the forms.

### Good Day Riders!

As we move toward the spring season and warmer days, I'm sure, as I am, you're ready to get back on the motorcycle and hit the road.

Some of you may have ridden through the whole year while others have had their bike put away in winter storage, that is the group I want to address. What I want to talk about may be old news to most of you, but it's always nice to have a reminder.

Let's discuss Motorcycle Safety as the riding season begins, before you even put that key in the ignition, there are a few things you really need to do. Start with;

-Take a walk around the bike, start by looking at every part. Look for leaks on the ground. Do you smell gas or other fluids? Examine pivot points, are any showing wear and tear? Test the lights and horn.

- Drain and refill fluids. Don't start the riding season with old gas, drain and replenish with fresh gas, check all fluid levels.
- Definitely check your brakes for leakage, wear and tear. Are the lines and cables in good working order?
- Give the air filter a look, either clean or replace the filter
- Make sure the battery is in good working order. How old is your battery? If around the 5 year mark you may want to think about replacing it (personal experience)
- Inspect your tires for proper inflation, check for signs of damage such as dry rot, cracks
- If applicable, clean and lube your chain.
- Give your bike a good wash and clean, also it helps to discover some of the smaller issues.
- The most important thing when it comes to motorcycle safety is to brush up on your riding skills, especially if you haven't ridden in a while. Take a few small trips around the neighborhood before tackling the highway, these small trips will help you see if everything is in working

order. Take a look at your riding equipment, helmet, jacket, boots and gloves.

Ride Safe and ALWAYS LOOKOUT FOR THE OTHER GUY (or GIRL). Don't want anything to happen to my riding buddies.


### **Boys State / Girls State**

Post's who pay for their candidate's travel expenses to the Boys State program will be reimbursed up to \$625. It is the responsibility of the Post who sponsors a candidate to pay for travel expenses.

If your Post does not have an Auxiliary chapter, the Post can still sponsor a young lady to the Girls State program. Remember that there is **NO** reimbursement for any Girls State travel expenses.

The Stones of St. Stephen's Church Are Still Speaking: Are We Listening?

"On a chilly, rainy day in the autumn of 1929, several thousand people converged on a sacred site 54 miles northeast of Paris, France. This scene was not one of the well-established pilgrimage locations that adorn the geography of France; rather, it was the newly reconstructed Belleau church."

"The pilgrims and attendees were a unique conglomeration of French villagers, religious leaders such as the Bishop of Soissons, military leaders including General Gouraud, former commander of the 4th French Army, and General Clarence Edwards, former commander of the Yankee Division (both pictured). That all of these individuals had gathered for a pilgrimage was not necessarily unique as many military veterans made pilgrimages to sites along the Western Front after the war."

- · Teen pregnancy prevention programs


