## POST COMMANDER'S COMMENTS... BRUCE TEMPLEMAN

A word from the Commander...

New Year ahead: We have come a long way since our founding and we have more challenges ahead. The fun never stops. We have a large, yet untapped resource that we need to tap to make this Post the best in the Department. That untapped resource is our membership, seventynine strong and growing. We have THo1 Legionnaires throughout the Kingdom of Thailand and across the USA. With a network like that, we should be able to tap into a vast repository of their knowledge and experiences. For example, how do they cope with medical situations here in Thailand? How has the VA and FMP been working for them? What tips for immigration visits do they have and what traps to avoid? All these types of questions can be discussed when we do our buddy checks, both formal and informal. Pass the word to other members. Bring them up at the Post meetings so we can capture those ideas and advice in our meeting minutes and post them in our newsletters. As I've said on many other occasions, our decentralized membership is not a weakness.

It's our strength! We have veterans across the globe that are situated to help other veterans. The key to this is communication. In the year ahead, I would like to see more of our members get out and physically meet with other members. It would be a good thing for us to have a social event somewhere in the center of our membership area so we can meet face to face. Our buddy checks are a valuable tool for communication and I remind everyone of our bylaws, particularly Article 11 (Notices) "Every member shall furnish the Post Adjutant with his or her correct address for mailing purposes. If available, members shall also provide a current telephone number and email address." We really need everyone to give us an avenue to communicate with them, just as we give every veteran several avenues to communicate with the Post. YOU ARE THE REASON THIS POST EXISTS, so please COMMUNICATE.

## Some significant events coming up soon are:

**1. Post Officer Elections:** Below is a summary of the Post bylaws for holding Post elections:

## "Section 1. General

1. Elections will be held annually for all elected offices and executive committee members-at-large.

2. The Post elections will normally be by open election; however, the election may be by ballot if requested. **Election by ballot must be requested and approved by the members at the February Monthly Post meeting.** This will allow sufficient time for preparation of nominations and ballots. If election by ballot is not requested and approved at the February meeting, the Post will hold an open election as described in Section 2 of this article. 3. The election will be held annually at the regular meeting in April of each year.

4. Newly elected officers will take office at the Post Meeting following the election.

## Section 2. General Open Election

1. The elected officers and executive committee members shall be nominated from the floor at the meeting preceding the annual election and at the meeting of the annual election.

2. The election shall be by show of hands of members present or members on video conference. The candidate receiving the highest number of votes shall be elected to the respective office for which they are a candidate.

3. Nominations for officers and executive committee members will be made at the March meeting. Nominations may be made orally at the March meeting including via Google Meet. Members can also email nominations providing they have already gotten the acceptance from the person they are nominating. Nominations will be emailed to the Post email address <u>amerilegion@gmail.com</u> prior to the March meeting. All nominations will be final at the end of the March meeting.

## Section 3. Election by ballot (IF REQUESTED AND APPROVED AT THE FEBRUARY MEETING)

1. At least two weeks prior to the April meeting the adjutant will email ballots to all the Post members in good standing. The email votes must be sent to the Post email address, adjutant@americanlegionthailand.com a t least three days prior to the April Post meeting. This is to allow the adjutant time to collect the email ballots and have them ready for tabulation at the Post election.

 Members must turn in ballots the day of the meeting prior to the start of the meeting.
The ballots will be tallied at the April meeting. The completed ballots will be collected and given to the Adjutant. The Commander will appoint a Post Officer and two Members-at-Large who will count the ballots. Results will be announced before the conclusion of the April meeting. Ballots will be kept as a matter of Post records.

4. Any request for recount and or audit of the election will be requested in writing. Any expenses resulted from the requested recount or audit will be the sole responsibility of the requestor.

The Adjutant must certify the elected officers are eligible members in good standing and report the findings to the Department at least 15 days prior to the Department Convention."

**2. National Dues:** National has raised its dues \$5.00 per capita, therefore reducing the amount that the Post has for doing its business. The discussion as to raise our Post dues issue will be an agenda item for the January 10th Post meeting. Our deadline to confirm our Post dues is 1 March, so the decision to that matter will be taken at the January meeting.

3. Membership renewals: National will allow members to renew for two years at a time beginning July 1st, 2024. This is a good deal all around and I encourage all annual members to do it. Did you know that you can elect to have your dues automatically paid every year. Just supply your credit card and when the time rolls around for renewal, The American Legion will automatically renew your membership. Not bother, no headache - what could be better!

**4. The Federal Voting Assistance Program** is now in high gear. If you need assistance registering to vote, please contact our Service Officer, Larry Haynie. We also have Post members that are Civilian Liaison Volunteers with the US Embassy that can assist you as well. Wayne Wright, John Skabry, and Bruce Templeman.

5. FBAR: This is a reminder for those of you who have assets in a foreign bank totaling \$10,000.00 or more. Annually you must file a Report of Foreign Bank & Financial Accounts. (FBAR) to the US Treasury Department. To assist you, clink on the link is provided here and follow the simple instructions: File Your FBAR. If you have any questions or need any assistance, contact Jeff Ludwig our Finance Officer and he can help step you through the process.

6. Tawanchai Foundation: April is the month in which American Legion Post THo1 and VFW Post

10217 donate to the Tawanchai Foundation. Please ask your friends and acquaintances to donate to this worthy cause. Our Finance Officers will provide you with a receipt for your generous donation. You can help change a child's life giving them a chance at brighter future.

Once I get your information, I can validate and if needed correct your contact information that is on file with the Post and the American Legion. # SAFETY MESSAGE

# TRAVEL SAFETY TIPS

With millions people preparing to travel to visit friends and family, and with the majority of holiday travelers driving, here are a few safety tips to take with you on the road:

• **Get your vehicle road-ready:** Check your vehicle fluid levels, battery, tire pressure, and condition, and fill up your gas tank before starting your trip.

• **Plan your route:** Plan your driving route ahead of departing. Check for road construction and road closures along the way in case you need to reroute. If the weather is severe, consider postponing or canceling your travel plans.

• **Buckle up:** Wearing a seatbelt is one of the simplest and most effective ways to stay safe on the road. Remind everyone else in the vehicle to buckle their seatbelts as well.

• **Prepare for emergencies:** Be prepared for an unexpected emergency, such as a car accident, breakdown, flat tire, or medical issue, by keeping a stash of emergency supplies in your vehicle. Supplies should include a flashlight, blanket, extra gloves and hats, a first-aid kit, basic hand tools, a phone charger, snacks, and bottled water.

• **Don't drink and drive:** If you are going to be driving this holiday season, be sure to avoid the spiked eggnog. Never risk the safety of family, friends, or others on the road by drinking and driving.

• **Stay focused on the road:** Distracted driving is one of the leading causes of traffic

accidents. Help yourself stay focused on the road at all times by assigning a navigator to handle any GPS device and refraining from talking on the phone or texting while driving. Take a short break every so often to revive your energy and focus, and split up driving responsibilities with others in the vehicle if possible.

• Drive defensively: Be aware of what other drivers around you are doing and keep an eye out for drivers who may be operating their vehicle recklessly due to distraction or the influence of alcohol. Give yourself plenty of space between other cars on the road and avoid sudden stops. Don't expect the other guy to stop at stop signs. Be vigilant and expect the unexpected because it will happen. Remember this is Thailand.

• **Go slow and be patient:** It may sound simple, but having a little extra patience while out on the road goes a long way in ensuring that you arrive safely at your destination. This is especially true if you are on one of the busy two lane roads behind one of the large trucks. Pass safely.

• Watch out for motorbikes. Unlike in the USA motorbike are prevalent throughout Thailand. Often the motorbikes are operated by unlicensed youths who have very little knowledge of the rules of the road.
