A BILL

If food supply stores donate their food that is about to expire or spoil, they will receive a tax break from the government.

Be it enacted by The American Legion Boys Nation Senate assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "FOOD ACT: Finding Other Options Than Disposal".

SECTION 2. CREATING A TAX BREAK FOR FOOD SUPPLY STORES THAT HAVE PACKAGED FOOD

The Qualifications are-

(1) Any food supply store that has packaged foods will be able to qualify

for the tax break

(2) The store shall set out the food that is about to

expire; the store will

not have the burden of delivering the food to the food bank; the food

bank will come get the food

(3) Before the food is taken to the food bank, it is inspected to insure

that the food has not surpassed its expiration date

(4) The stores will keep track of the dollar amount of the food that was

donated

(5) The tax deduction is the value of the food that a store donates dollar

for dollar

SECTION 3. CREATING A TAX BREAK FOR FOOD SUPPLY STORES THAT DONATE NON-PACKAGED FOOD. THE QUALIFICATIONS ARE-

(1) Any food supply store that has non-packaged foods will also be able to

qualify for the tax break

(2) Food such as produce that are not packaged meals need to be put in

boxes to be taken away by

the food bank

(3) The store shall move the food in a sanitary manner into the boxes; the

food shall also be

taken care of as if it were in the grocery store; the foods that need

to be refrigerated

shall be refrigerated

(4) The store shall set out the food that is about to

expire; the store will

not have the burden of delivering the food to the food bank; the food

bank will come get the food

(5) Before the food is taken to the food bank, it is inspected to insure

that the food has not spoiled

(6) The stores will keep track of the dollar amount of the food that was

donated.

(7) The tax deduction is the value of the food that a store donates dollar

for dollar.
