Mr. Coberly of Wyoming introduced the following bill;

A BILL

Maintaining the legitimacy of the United States electoral system by requiring a form of government issued identification in order to register to vote, to vote in person, or receive an absentee ballot.

Be it enacted by The American Legion Boys Nation Senate assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "Voter Identification Act".

SECTION 2. Whereas the rules of the electoral system varies in each State and the number of voters increases with every election, legitimacy of National elections is questioned with every election cycle.

Whereas the number of non-U.S. Citizen residents are growing, the possibility of voter fraud increases.

Therefore the Voter Identification Act will ensure a solid standard for each State to adhere to in conducting an election which determines a Federal Office such as President, Senator, or Member of

the House of Representatives, which will be to require a form of United States Government issued identification in order to register to vote, vote in person, or receive an absentee ballot.

Therefore a form of Government issued identification will ensure that U.S. Citizens will be the only residents of the United States eligible to vote.

Section 3. Definitions

Non-U.S. Citizen resident: Pertains to those residing in the United States as either an illegal resident, Temporary Resident, Permanent Resident.

Government Issued Identification: Any form of Identification that is issued by a federal, state, county, tribal, or municipal entity. This include the following:

- a.State issued driver's license
- b. Tribal identification card issued by the governing body of any of the officially recognized Native American Tribes in the United States
- c. A valid U.S. Passport
- d. United States Military Card
- e. Valid Medicaid Insurance Card
- f. Valid Medicare Insurance Card
- g. Birth Certificate
- h. Social Security Card

Section 4. Voter Identification Act

The Voter Identification Act entails that:

- a. In any election that determines the Federal Offices of President of the United States, United States Senator, or Member of the United States House of Representatives it will be the States' and citizens' duty to adhere to the following:

b. In order for a person to register to vote, vote in person, or obtain an absentee ballot they must do so by presenting a form of Government Issued Identification.

c. In the case of applying for an Absentee Ballot via mail, a person may give a copy of Government Issued Identification.

d. In the case of applying for an Absentee Ballot online, a person may give a digital copy of Government Issued Identification.

Section 5. Effective Date

This act shall be effective for all citizens of the United States on or after January 1, 2022
