Increasing regulations of noxious chemicals in food produced and distributed in the United States that ensures citizens are being fed only real foods without unnecessary/harmful additives.

Mr. Enright of New York introduced the following bill;

A BILL

Increasing regulations of noxious chemicals in food produced and distributed in the United States that ensures citizens are being fed only real foods without unnecessary/harmful additives.

Be it enacted by The American Legion Boys Nation Senate assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "The Real Food Act".

SECTION 2. That the use of any said additive in any food product produced or distributed in the United States within the meaning of this Act, is hereby prohibited; and any company or individual who continues to use these chemicals in food products will be faced with fines and hence be prohibited from providing food services in the United States. Total ban of these chemicals include-

(1) Petroleum-derived Red 40, Blue 2, Yellow 5, Yellow 6- linked to adrenal tumors, allergic reactions, ADHD in children;

- (2) Potassium Bromate and Azodicarbonamide, category 2B carcinogen;
- (3) Brominated Vegetable Oil, linked to memory loss, skin rashes, birth defects etc;
- (4) Propylparaben preservative, linked to breast cancer, infertility etc;
- (5) BHT and BHA preservatives, linked to cancer;
- (6) Ractopamine, linked to reproductive and cardiovascular damage;
- (7) Olestra, linked to diarrhea

SECTION 3. That the evaluation of food products produced from within the United States or entering the country from abroad will be made in the Bureau of Chemistry of the Department of Agriculture.

SECTION 4. That any article of food that contains listed chemicals is to be discarded and labeled unfit for consumption.

SECTION 5. No funds shall be drawn from the Treasury, but in Consequence of Appropriations made by Law.

SECTION 6. That this Act shall be in force and effect from and after the first day of January, two thousand and twenty-five.
