A BILL

The "Continuation of Offshore Wind Research" bill will allocate good paying jobs, and renewable energy to the coastline of the United States of America. Where funding will be increased to support this continuation of renewable energy research.

Be it enacted by The American Legion Boys Nation Senate assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "The Continuation of Offshore Wind Research".

Section 2:

(1) Whereas the United States is set to produce 30 gigawatts of offshore wind energy by 2030, and 15 gigawatts of floating offshore wind by 2035, the allocation of 85,000,000,000 dollars will be allocated towards the production, and continuation of the offshore wind turbine industry.

(2) As the offshore wind industry will need 15,000-58,000 every year between 2024-2030, the

allocation of the funds will support the economic status of Americans.

(3) The \$85,000,000,000 will provide good paying jobs for the coastal United States. The production of the Offshore Wind Turbines, as well as the continuation of renewable energy research.

(4) The carrying out and allocation of these funds will be determined by the United States Department of Energy. The funds will go into effect in fiscal year 2024.

(5) Any surplus of these funds will be reallocated towards the salaries and research of the Offshore Wind Industry.
