Bans Build Your Own gun kits. Requires all people 3-D printing guns, regardless of intent to sell, to possess a Type 7 license from the Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms Agency (ATF).

Mr. Spears of Ohio introduced the following bill;

A BILL

Bans Build Your Own gun kits. Requires all people 3-D printing guns, regardless of intent to sell, to possess a Type 7 license from the Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms Agency (ATF).

Be it enacted by The American Legion Boys Nation Senate assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "The Ghost Gun Regulation Act".

SECTION 2. Let it be defined that a "Build-Your-Own" gun kit is a kit of pre-manufactured weapon parts, sold disassembled. This act will ban the possession, manufacture, sale, and purchase of all Build-Your-Own gun kits within the United States of America. Any person caught making, selling, distributing, purchasing, or using a Build-Your-Own gun kit shall be sentenced to no more than 1.5 years in federal prison and no more than a \$15,000 fine for the first offense. For the second offense the offender shall be sentenced no more than 4.5 years in federal prison and no more offense the offender shall be sentenced a minimum of 6.5 years in federal prison and a minimum fine of \$25,000. These

offenses shall be considered felonies in the third degree. Anyone that currently possesses such a kit shall turn it in to the ATF by the date this becomes effective.

SECTION 3. Let it be defined the a 3-D printed gun is a weapon that has been primarily produced from 3-D printed material. Any person manufacturing 3-D printed guns, regardless of intent to sell, are required to posses a Type 7 license from the ATF. Any person caught without a Type 7 license that is printing materials to assemble a 3-D printed weapon shall be sentenced to no more than 1 year in federal prison and no more than a \$10,000 fine for the first offense. For the second offense the offender shall be sentenced no more than 3.5 years in federal prison and no more than a \$15,000 fine. For the third or more offense the offender shall be sentenced a minimum of 5 years in federal prison and a minimum fine of \$22,000. These offenses shall be considered felonies in the fourth degree.

SECTION 4. This act shall go into effect and be enforceable on the 1st day of March, 2024.
