Mr. Altena of South Dakota introduced the following bill;

A BILL

Lowering the maximum amount of appropriations dedicated towards farm subsidies for commercial sized farm operations.

Be it enacted by The American Legion Boys Nation Senate assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "Farmers Funding Adjustment Act".

SECTION 2. Limiting appropriations to commercial farms

Let it be stated that all farms with the following statistics shall receive a maximum of \$75000 per farm unit annually from the USDA subsidy program. If a farm is growing 750 or more acres of crops such as Corn, Soybeans, Rice, Wheat, or Cotton, this funding limit applies. Farms producing these crops that fall under 750 acres will remain eligible for the maximum of \$125000 per farms unit annually.

*A Farm Unit is a designated plot of land of 10 acres or greater that produces the above mentioned crops per federal fiscal year.
